\*Note that there is an additional 3% Bed Tax on Hotel/Motel and transient lodging. The State also imposes a different rate of 6.325% for transient lodging. The combined rate is 11.325%

There are certain activities that are taxed only by the City and not by the State. These include advertising, residential and commercial rental. For these transactions, the combined rate is only 2.00%.

### PRESCOTT IS A "PROGRAM CITY"

Effective January 1, 2017, the City of Prescott is participating in the centralized tax collection with the Arizona Department of Revenue (ADOR). This means that taxpayers will register and remit the City of Prescott's Transaction Privilege Tax to ADOR. The State then disburses the collections to Prescott based on the tax reports submitted. It is very important to make sure your tax report indicates that part of the payment is designated for Prescott with region code PR.

### **HOW DO I GET A LICENSE?**

Applying for a license is done through ADOR at <a href="www.aztaxes.gov">www.aztaxes.gov</a>. The application is processed within 24 hours. ADOR staff is available weekdays between 8 am and 5 pm if you have any questions or need assistance. Contact toll-free at 1(800) 352-4090 or direct at 1(602) 255-3381.

You elect to mail in the application as well. Please go to <a href="www.azdor.gov">www.azdor.gov</a> to download and complete the form. Once processed, the ADOR will mail your TPT license

directly to you at the mailing address you have indicated.

New license applications for contractors must be mailed to ADOR using the forms available online at <a href="www.azdor.gov">www.azdor.gov</a>. New or out of state contractors may be required to post a bond before applying for a TPT license.

# WHAT IF I ALREADY HAVE A STATE TPT LICENCE?

If you have an ADOR TPT license, you can add additional cities to your license online at www.AZtaxes.gov.

You can add the location by completing the Business Account Update form online by logging into your AZTaxes account and select Business Account Update. You may also complete a printable form that can be found on the ADOR website under TPT Forms in the left hand column of the Transaction Privilege Tax section.

### **HOW DO I SUBMIT TAX?**

Filing online is available at <a href="https://www.aztaxes.gov">www.aztaxes.gov</a>. In order to pay tax to the City of Prescott on ADOR's forms, you will enter taxable activity information on the "PRESCOTT" City Name and City Code of "PR".

A schedule of due dates is available at <a href="https://www.azdor.gov">www.azdor.gov</a>. The taxes are due on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the month following the month (or other reporting period) in which the tax is collected or accrued.

This publication is for general information regarding Transaction Privilege (Sales) Tax. For complete details, refer to the City of Prescott Privilege & Use Tax Code and related regulations. In the case of an inconsistency or omission in this publication, the language of the Model City Tax Code will prevail. The transaction privilege tax is commonly referred to as a sales tax, however, under State of Arizona law, the tax is on the privilege of doing business in Prescott and is not a true sales

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
