Background

The City of Prescott is regulated under the Total Gallons Per Capita per Day (GPCD) Program. The annual gallons per capita per day water usage within the service area must be limited to the amount allowed under its total GPCD requirement. Within ADWR's Prescott AMA Fourth Management Plan, the Total GPCD requirement is 155 (pg. 5-4, Table 5A). For the 2020 reporting year from ADWR, the City's requirement is 155 GPCD and its actual is 112 GPCD.

For Reporting Year 2020, the Flex Account balance is 1,696.82 acre-feet. To date the City has not had to rely on this account. The maximum flex account credit is 30, while the maximum flex account debit is -10.

Furthermore, the City's three-year average of Lost & Unaccounted for Water is 8.25%, below the 10% maximum.

The City of Prescott has several ordinances directed at limiting water use.

The Rebate Incentive Program rewards utility customers who choose low water use, high efficiency appliances, remove turf grass, purchase WaterSense Smart irrigation timers, install rainwater cisterns or rain barrels, and capture stormwater directed to a rain garden. The utility customer receives a credit on their monthly bill.
